

Survivor Week B: 17th to 22nd August 2019

Things you & your young person will need to know:

What to do to secure the best price:

To book a place to come with us to Soul Survivor you must fill in the consent form then give it to Andy or hand into the church office along with a cheque for £102 (**non-returnable deposit**). The cheques need to be made payable to 'Christ the King' (we can take card payments in person now too)

Transport:

Peterborough Showground is just down the road so it would be fantastically wonderful if parents could help with transporting the teenagers to Soul Survivor like in 2017 & 2018. You'll be able to drop them off from 12noon. Then collection is about 5 days later, families this year car shared.

Soul Survivor's Rules: (for everyone)

Strictly no alcohol on site.

No boys in girls' tents and vice versa (unless they are married).

Ball games are to be finished by 10pm - even if there is a nil-nil outcome.

No crossing into any area that has been marked out of bounds.

Event wristbands must be worn at all times - they are the only way to get into the site venues.

There is a charge for lost wristbands.

You must not leave the camp area after midnight.

Try to make sure you're keeping the leaders informed of what you are up to or when you need to be somewhere or do something. (we love cheering for the fun runners, watching the skaters and listening to those playing on the bandstand!)

Our Rules: (for campers)

Obey all of the above rules!

You will need to return to the campsite for breakfast, lunch and dinner (when provided) at the set times. We love cooking for you and would like you to eat all the meals. (please let us know of any additional dietary needs in advance)

We all go to the Big Top meetings together.

You should aim to attend one seminar a day (at least!)

You must be back at our campsite by midnight at the latest (and signed in) and lights out (and all quiet!) by 1am.

Always be in groups of at least 2, particularly after dark. Make sure one of the leaders knows roughly where you are.

If you have a problem, please tell one of the group leaders as soon as you can so we can help and support you, before contacting your parents.

Remember that you have a responsibility to keep yourself and your things safe.

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What is Soul Survivor?

An annual summer camp that hosts thousands of teenagers and their leaders lasting five days, 2019 is the last ever one which is why we want to book early! Each day there's two main gatherings and loads to do! You can hang out in one of the many venues with friends, grab a hot chocolate mountain from the food court, join in with sports, shred the skate park, gaming and more! Even watch a movie or two in the open-air cinema. All this is intermingled with worship, teaching and Soul Talks (seminars).

When is Soul Survivor?

Soul Survivor Week B (the one we go to) starts **Saturday the 17th of August** and finishes **Thursday the 22nd of August**, we can arrive on site from 12noon and make camp. The main meeting is at 7pm that night. If you could then collect your lovely teenager by 9:30am in the morning on **Thursday the 22nd of August** or the evening of the 21st by prior arrangement.

Where is Soul Survivor?

Week B takes place at the lovely Peterborough Showground, you've guessed it in Peterborough!!! (just like last year) the post code for depositing teenagers is: PE2 6XE and we will find out which village we are on around about June or July 2018.

Why go to Soul Survivor?

Soul Survivor is an amazingly interactive way to learn more about yourself and God while discovering what it means to put your faith into action in practical ways. We also camp with other groups of young people from around the country which is a great way to make new friends that have the same faith as we do.

How much will it be?

This year the cost will be:

£165 before 31st of December 2019
Or £175 by the 22nd of April 2019
Or £185 after the 2nd of May 201

This includes the festival fee of £102 before Jan 30th, £112 until the 30th of April and £123 after May 1st, all the meals and tent space you'll need. If you are thinking of going on team or more than one member of your family going please speak to Andy so we can adjust the cost accordingly.

This can be paid however works for your family but, a non-returnable deposit of £102 by the 31st of December and the remaining balance by May half term 2019. Please speak to Andy Stilwell if you need any support with organising the funding to enable your son or daughter to go or indeed want to spread the cost.
